

Why share this story?

In the United States:

1. Heroin-related overdose deaths in the US increased 5X from 2010-2017
2. Every day an estimated 130 Americans die after overdosing on opioids
3. There were nearly 50,000 opioid overdose deaths in 2017
4. We have about four percent of the world's population but 27% of all drug overdose deaths and 80% of all opioid prescriptions
5. More than 17,000 people died from prescription opioid overdoses in 2017
6. 22.35 million Americans are in recovery

Opioid Overdose Prevention Partnership

King County Department of Community and Human Services is working with its partners to prevent injury and death from opioid overdose. The Housing and Community Development Program is making naloxone kits available to homeless housing and service providers to promote better health and safety in our community.

King County Needle Exchange

The needle exchange is a public health program for people who use drugs by injection. It is an important component of a comprehensive set of programs designed to reduce the spread of HIV and other blood-borne infections among people who inject drugs, their families and communities. Needle exchange programs provide new, sterile syringes and clean injection equipment in exchange for used, contaminated syringes. They also get drug users into drug treatment and health care.
