Book-It Repertory Theatre is a non-profit organization dedicated to transforming great literature into great theatre, through simple and sensitive production, and to inspiring its audiences to read.

Founded in Seattle in 1990, Book-It Repertory Theatre holds to the belief that reading and literacy are fundamental rights and keys to success. Book-It creates world-premiere adaptations of classic and contemporary literature for the stage, preserving the narrative text as it is spoken, not by a single "narrator" but as dialogue by the characters in the production. This technique, developed over the past 31 years, continues to evolve to serve our mission.

Book-It serves approximately 15,000 patrons through its main stage 4- or 5-play production season, and over 50,000 young people in touring productions and school residencies throughout Washington. Our income is derived through earned revenue in ticket and concession sales and contributions from individuals, corporations, foundations, and government entities. For the 2020-21 Season, Book-It will be producing five audio dramas adapted from shorts stories and novellas.
